### **Rules for Chess 960**

F.1 Before a Chess960 game, a starting position is randomly set up, subject to certain rules. After this, the game is played in the same way as standard chess. In particular, pieces and pawns have their normal moves.,

### **F.2 Starting position requirements**

The starting position for Chess960 must meet certain rules. White pawns are placed on the second rank and all remaining white pieces are placed randomly on the first rank, with following restrictions:

- a. the king is placed somewhere between the two rooks, and
- b. the bishops are placed on opposite-colored squares, and
- c. the black pieces are placed equal-and-opposite to the white pieces.

All games of a round will have same starting position. Starting position will change for every round

### F.3 Chess960 Castling Rules

The castling manoeuvre in Chess 960 is performed by one of these four methods:

- 1. double-move castling: by on one turn making a move with the king and a move with the rook, or
- 2. transposition castling: by transposing the position of the king and the rook, or
- 3. king-move-only castling: by making only a move with the king, or
- 4. rook-move-only castling: by making only a move with the rook.

After castling, the rook and king's final positions are exactly same, as they would be in standard chess.


For first illegal moves or irregularity as decided by the arbiter, there will be no time penalty. Instead, an yellow card will be shown to the player. For the second illegal move or irregularity, the player will be shown a red card and he shall lose the game.

- 1. In some starting positions, the king or rook (but not both) do not move during castling.
- 2. In some starting positions, castling can take place as early as the first move.
- 3. In some starting positions, some squares can stay filled during castling that would have to be vacant in standard chess. For example, after c-side castling (O-O-O), it's possible for to have a, b, and/or e still filled, and after g-side castling (O-O), it's possible to have e and/or h filled.

**Chess Doubles:** Entry must be given as a pair of two players. The team name may be the two partners or any other name (like Madras Tigers). If a different name is registered, the names of two individual players must be enclosed.

- 1) Seeding will be according to the average rating of the two players. Unrated player = 1000
- 2) Player 1 of Team A will make the first move for his team (say e4) with white pieces
- 3) Player 1 of Team B will make the first move for his team with black pieces (say e5)
- 4) Player 2 of Team A will make the next move for his team, without consulting his partner
- 5) Thus, Player 1 will make the odd numbered moves and Player 2 will make even numbered moves for their teams
- 6) Only player making the move must press the clock
- 7) Team mate must not inform his partner that he has forgotten to press the clock or that it is his turn to move
- 8) Team mates shall not speak with each other and shall not look at each other. They shall not make any sign to their team mate and shall not point the pieces with their hands.
- 9) For any such malpractice or illegal move or any irregularity as decided by the arbiter, an **yellow** card will be handed over to their team. For second such malpractice, they will be shown a **red** card and the team will lose the game.
- 10) Rapid rules will be followed
- 11) Arbiter's decision is final and there is no appeal against the decision.
